Port NOLA is committed to working with local, state, and federal transportation partners to design and build a new roadway in St. Bernard Parish as a parallel project to the Louisiana International Terminal. The project envisions an elevated roadway along the 40 Arpent Canal that connects Lower St. Bernard to the interstate system.
